**RE: THE PROPAGATION OF SUBJECTIVE REALITY THROUGH "TRANSGENDERISM"**

Men:

I went before you in December and January and warned you that humanism would eventually come marching into our County, demanding our allegiance.<sup>1</sup> I warned of this in light of last year's Supreme Court *Obergefell* decision, now parlayed into other positive law "rights". The Board wisely listened to me.

Along with my verbal comments I wrote a *Motion in Favor of Education Freedom*. That document, and my work as an attorney and President of Deconstructing the Coliseum, propagates the God's honest truth that the civil government has no right to operate schools – *on any level*. The Tenth Amendment does not prevail on this issue; the Establishment Clause does not; nor does Patrick Henry – Romans 13 does. The civil government is to promote good and punish *evildoers*. The civil government has no jurisdiction over the heart and mind, over forward-looking discipleship. The civil government has only the God-given right over backward-looking punishment. God has retained for himself jurisdiction over thought.<sup>2</sup> Thomas Jefferson and James Madison brought conformity to God's Word when they helped abolish Virginia's established Anglican Church. We must bring conformity to God's Word by abolishing the civil government school system. Such a time as *now* is always when to best express obedience to the Lord Jesus.

For far too long, because of the Christian Establishment<sup>3</sup>, Christians have been on defense. I ask the Board to now consider an offensive approach; one that will counter the federal civil government's tyranny. Virginians have a great history in not just standing against tyranny, but defeating it. George Washington, Patrick Henry, Thomas Jefferson, James Madison. You men have the potential to be in such company.

I urge you to consider working towards rejecting the federal civil government's payments to our civil government schools. The feds are not even giving us money, as they are running deficits! So every dollar given is "backed" with each civil government student incurring debt; so it is literally the case that the federal civil government controls our "local" schools by incurring our children to indebtedness. The federal civil government wins that exchange: they control our children.<sup>4</sup> The chickens have come home to roost. Abolishing civil government schools will prevent that from happening again.

What the Board must do first is commission the School Superintendent to report back, in his best estimation, how much it costs Campbell County Schools to comply with the small amount of federal civil government dollars received.

The second thing that must be done is Campbell County property taxes must be lowered. This will assist those who want to leave the inherently humanistic system, eventually saving the civil government school system money. *Education will thrive if the civil government stops bottlenecking the inalienable right to free-thought.*

Oftentimes, when speaking to Christians, instead of going through the machinations of teaching how the Bible does justify the existence of civil government schools, I have to instead encourage those Christians that we are on the winning side of history; that their pastor was wrong about how we are not to polish brass on a sinking ship; *I have to give them a pep talk.* The Christian
